

CURB APPEAL

Curbside collection is a success in partnership with customers. With items set out correctly, one driver in an automated truck can neatly remove material and serve 1,000 homes a day. Some tips for cleaner streets and litter-free waterways:



- Bag all leaves, grass, twigs and pine needles in clear bags.
- Place no bags or boxes of trash outside the trash container.
- Crush boxes so they fit loosely in recycling containers.
- Separate each item by a three-foot clearance.
- Avoid putting trash on medians.
- Curbside setout: no sooner than 3 p.m. the day before & no later than midnight the scheduled day of collection.
- The city cannot take glass doors, mirrors or other such items that may break in the street. Please take these to the landfill.
- Ask about Hampton Waste Watcher's "Tour de Trash" to learn more.
