FY 2014 Annual Report

The Hampton Clean City Commission completed its annual reports to Keep America Beautiful and the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality on July 31. Here are a few of the highlights:

HCCC reported 1,156 events for the year, accomplished by 5,360 volunteers in 11,378 hours. Their contribution of time equaled \$250,657 and provided **284 weeks** worth of service to the city.

Among the activities HCCC volunteers and staff participated in were:

- ◆ 21 adult presentations that reached 644 people
- ◆ 164 youth presentations reaching 3,756 young people,
- ◆ 817 litter cleanups that removed an estimated 466 cubic yard of litter from our city,
- ◆ 7 tree planting events that put 870 tree seedlings in the ground
- ◆ 2 Schools Appearance Indexes and 1 Community Appearance & Litter Index
- ◆ 132 cubic yards of plastic bags collected from 11 schools
